

BBC Club young persons policy. (Under the age of 18)

Persons under the age of 18 can only access the club with an adult who has BBC ID pass or is a BBC club member.

All such young persons under the age of 18 must be signed in to the London Broadcasting House building following the visitors sign in procedure at Reception.

The accompanying adult must make sure to inform reception staff that Visitor Pass should be marked "Club Only".

The young person under the age of 18 must remain in the vicinity of BBC Club customer areas. Whilst in the Club the adult must remain with and supervise the U18 for the duration of the visit. The ratio for adult supervisor to young persons shall not exceed 1 adult to 3 young persons.

BBC Club has a zero tolerance policy regarding any conduct or behaviour deemed by a BBC Club staff member to have breached our conduct, behaviour or safety rules.

Access to working areas such as behind the bar or the kitchen/storerooms is strictly prohibited.

BBC Club reserves the right to move all visitors to a different location within BBC Club or ask them to leave altogether due to a previous booking, external visitors such as Radio Theatre audience or for any other reason which can remain undisclosed.

No person under 18 years of age shall obtain or attempt to obtain alcohol. Neither shall the accompanying adult obtain or attempt to obtain alcohol for consumption by a person under 18 years of age. Anyone transgressing this rule will be asked to leave the premises immediately.

All young persons under the age of 18 are allowed on the premises Monday - Friday up to 7.30pm and must be escorted out of the site by their accompanying adult, hand back their visitor lanyard and follow any other visitors procedures.

The conduct, behaviour and safety of the young person under the age of 18 remains the responsibility of the accompanying adult at all times. BBC Club will not accept liability for any safety issue, injury, nor accept claims for refunds or compensation arising from such.
